Theoretical classes

Class 1. History and Development of Palliative Care. Principles of Palliative Medicine. General principles of control and evaluation of symptoms.

Class 2. Basics pain and evaluation. Treatment of mild to moderate pain. A djuvant drugs for pain management.

Class 3. Treatment of severe pain. Morphine and alternative opioids. Strategy in difficult pain.

Class 4. General problems: anorexia and cachexia, weakness. Nutrition and hydration. Digestive problems: mouth care, evacuation disorders, opioid-induced constipation, nausea and vomiting, intestinal obstruction.

Class 5. Respiratory problems: breathlessness, cough and hemoptysis. Neurological problems: delirium and other symptoms. Emergency in Palliative Medicine.

Class 6 Palliative Care in late-stage organ failure.

Class 7. Ethical aspects of care at the end of life. Euthanasia and palliative care. Aragón d eath deserving law.

Class 8. Management agony. Situation last hours or days. Palliative Sedation. Suffering and spiritual care.
