4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as:

- 1. The academic supervisor outlines the methodological guidelines of the course in order to monitor the student's progress.
- 2. Individual follow-up for each student is carried out, providing them with individual guidance and supervision by means of face-to-face tutorials.
- 3. A final assessment is made by the supervisor, based on both external supervisor's and student's final reports.

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Practical approach through hands-on work outside the classroom.
- Dynamic student-supervisor relation, based on face-to-face tutorials.
- · Study and preparation of the final report.

Provisional course planning

 The schedule for the practical placements will be organised according to the needs and availability of collaborating institutions

Report submission

- Students are expected to submit a final report on their internships, once the internship is over.
- The deadline for submission of reports will be determined by the supervisor, bearing in mind the general deadline set in the academic calendar to record the students' marks.
- Moreover, students are allowed to request to be evaluated before the defence of their undergraduate dissertation so that the ECTS corresponding to this course can be added up to the total amount of credits taken by the students.

Assessment information

- Students have right to attend two examination calls per enrolment.
- In the event that he/she passed the report from the collaborating entity, but failed or did not submit the final report, the student would still be able to pass the course in the second exam call in September, without repeating their internship period.
- If the report were not submitted in September either, the student would need to reenrol in this course and do the internship again.
