 - 7. Aragon on the Threshold of the Renaissance (1458-1516).

 - 1. Sources and Historiography to the Modern History of Aragon. Aragon in the Context of the Hispanic Monarchy;
 - 2. Aragonese Institutions in the Hapsburg Age;
 - 3. The Aragonese Population in the 16th and 17th Centuries. Aragonese Society and Social Conflicts;
 - 4. Political Developments in the 16th and 17th Centuries;
 - 5. The War of Succession and New Plant Edict;
 - 6. The Expansion of the 18th Century;
 - 7. The Aragonese Society in the Enlightenment. Culture and Thought: Enlightenment and Tradition.
