4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, visits to industrial facilities, practical exercises, self-assessment and attendance to seminars or conferences.

4.2.Learning tasks

The course consists of 7 ECTS ECTS distributed as follows:

- Type 1. Lectures (2.4ECTS): 60 hours. 34.28% workload.
- Type 2. Problems and Case studies (0.4 ECTS): 10 hours. 5.71% workload.
- Type 6. Guided practical assignments and coursework (0.8 ECTS): 20 hours. 11.42% workload.
- Type 7. Study and autonomous work (3.2 ECTS): 80 hours. 45.71% workload.
- Type 8. Test (0.2 ECTS): 5 hours. 2.85% workload.

4.3.Syllabus

The program that the student is offered to help you achieve the expected results includes the following activities:

- Conferences. Presentation of the course contents through lectures illustrated with examples.
- Self-assessment exercises and learning. In each of the topics covered by the teachers, they prepare a series of questions: specific and short development, and type test. Its aim is for students to internalize the basic contents of the course.
- Practical cases. Case studies to practice solving the problems posed by the management of risks related to safety at work, from detection risk through its evaluation to end in the elimination or control risk.
- Seminars. Several seminars that deal with monographically proposed some specific issues.
- Visits to industrial facilities. They try to give a real picture of the risks and preventive measures implemented in a work environment.
