1. General information

The aim of this subject is to provide students with basic tools for the commentary, at the different levels of philological work, of Greek texts from the archaic and classical periods at an intermediate level, which, due to their importance and richness, are fundamental for the student's formative development.

2. Learning results

1.- Knowledge of the diachronic evolution and synchronic state of the Greek language, with attention to literary texts of archaic and classical times.

2.- Essential mastery of the techniques of Greek philology for the comprehensive knowledge of texts, especially in their literary aspects.

3.- Proficiency in the theory and practice of translation applied to classical Greek in literary texts of the archaic and classical periods.

4.- Skill in applying the currents of interpretive theory and study of Greek texts according to extrinsic and intrinsic criteria of literature.

5.- Elementary mastery of the complementary techniques of Greek philology for the comprehensive knowledge of texts.

6.- Know and understand the cultural traits of Greek civilization and its continuation in the cultural foundations of present-day Europe and Western civilization.

3. Syllabus

1.- Greek text commentary: materials, techniques and objectives.

2.- The world of archaic Greek literature: thought and literature.

4. Academic activities

-Presentation of theoretical topics of the syllabus by the teacher.

-Classroom commentary of texts and their translation.

-Autonomous commentary and translation of texts.

-Autonomous reading of the programmed readings.

5. Assessment system

First call:

Continuous assessment

Test 1. Text commentary assigned to the student at the beginning of the term (30% of the final grade). Attention will be paid to

the clarity and organization of the exposition, the richness of the material adduced for the commentary and the student's ability to relate the text to its literary and cultural context.

Test 2. Reading test: students will report on their reading in a written exercise (30% of the final grade), which will assess reading comprehension and the acquisition of an overview of the themes and motifs studied.

Test 3. Written exercise on a theoretical topic based on a text discussed in class including translation without dictionary (40% of the final grade). The student's ability to bring into play their knowledge of the cultural and literary aspects of the text will be assessed. Writing, spelling, and clarity are issues that will also be assessed in the final grade.

In order to calculate the final average grade for the subject, at least a grade of "four" out of ten must be obtained in all tests.

Global assessment:

Same tests and criteria as the continuous evaluation.

Second call:

Global assessment with the same characteristics as in the first call.
