1.1. Aims of the course

Specific objectives:

- 1. Differentiate between psychopathology of adults and children and/or adolescents, so that the second is not a mere "downward" extension of the first and understanding that the child is constantly evolving, so diagnoses are not always They will be static or permanent.
- 2. Know the main diagnostic systems and develop a critical spirit for their application to particular cases.
- 3. Theoretical understanding of the importance of psychological evaluation and its practical application to the various contexts in which it will be developed in future professional practice.
- 4. Knowledge of the variety of psychological disorders in childhood, beyond the most common pathologies.
- 5. Incorporate a broad view of the techniques for diagnosing child psychopathologies.

4.2. Learning tasks
