4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. It is based on active methodologies that favor the development of critical thinking. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions, autonomous work and assessment tasks.

Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester. Classroom materials will be available via Moodle. These include a repository of the lecture notes used in class, the course syllabus, as well as other course-specific learning materials, including a discussion forum.

Further information regarding the course will be provided on the first day of class.

4.2. Learning tasks

This is a 5 ECTS course organized as follows:

Lectures (1.25 ECTS: 31.25 hours).

Practice sessions (0.5 ECTS: 12.5 hours).

Autonomous work (2.75 ECTS: 68.75 hours).

Tutorials (0.35 ECTS: 8.75 hours).

Assessment tasks (0.15 ECTS: 3.75 hours). A set of written and oral assignments and exams.

Topic 3. Everyday life. Stages of life. The body. Sex and transgressions. The Death

Topic 4. The one and the other. Europe and Europeans. Racism and xenophobia.

Topic 5. The Fear. Discipline and punish. Witchcraft.

Topic 6. Festivals. Image of power.

Topic 7. Religion, religious discourses and tolerances. Sin and confessional. Paradise and hell.

Topic 8. The disturbed world. Revolutionaries, millenarians and radicals.
