4.1. Methodological overview

The learning process will be conducted via lectures in which they will work, preferably, with written materials and audio-visual support (hearings, videos, and PowerPoint presentations). The theoretical exposition will always be combined with the practice aspect. The theoretical contents of the subject will be exposed and the compulsory reading works will be analysed, as well as a selection of other complementary literary and documentary texts and literary criticism that will be provided to the student. In the practical classes in the classroom, various activities will be carried out, including comments on specific samples of narrative texts. Both in the theoretical sessions and in the practical sessions an active implication is pursued, for which different activities will be carried out that favour motivation, critical thinking and debate among students.
