1. General information

1.1. Aims of the course

Objectives of the subject (General and specific)

E1 Access the sources of specialized information on the specific topics of the master and extract the relevant bibliographic sources for a specific topic of study.

E2 Formulate new research problems and the field of learning, personal development or multiculturalism, allowing to expand the areas of knowledge and interest of science and society

E3 Make decisions about the design of research to address specific problems taking into account scientific knowledge and in accordance with the values of professional ethics.

E4 Collect information and analyze it with scientific tools and guarantees.

E6 Plan processes for the analysis of the current educational reality characterized by the complexity derived from the diverse origins of the learners, the new learning objectives or the incorporation of technologies.

2.1. Competences

The learning results presented are relevant to the extent that an in-depth study of the state of the art related to the subject is carried out, as well as a critical analysis of a research article emphasizing its parts.

4. Methodology, learning tasks, syllabus and resources

4.1. Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. Both practical and theoretical tasks are aimed at becoming familiar with the current state of research. Bibliographic search will be a key aspect to find out about the main issues in the field, as well as the different research lines regarding the suggested topics. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as M01 ? Lectures, M02 - Review/analysis of reports and materials, M03 ? Assignments, and M04 ? Discussion groups.

Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester in order to make contributions to the course and to offer them options to prepare the Master?s dissertation.

Further information regarding the course will be provided on the first day of class.

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- A01 Lectures. The teacher will explain the course contents.

- A02 Practice sessions.
- A03 Assignments. Individually or in groups, students will elaborate a theoretical review on a certain topic of the syllabus under the supervision of the teacher.
- A04 Student oral presentations.
- A05 Discussion groups. A brief report on the readings will be done taking into account the contributions made during class discussions.
- A06 Autonomous work and study.
- A07 Follow-up and discussion of students' assignments.
- A08 Assessment tasks.

4.3. Syllabus

The course will address the following topics:

Topic 1. Research models in teaching interaction.

Topic 2. The challenges of interaction and communicative competence in socio-educational contexts.

Topic 3. Teaching communication. Personal and interpersonal communication. Transversal competences of communication in the academic and professional field.

Topic 4. Verbal and non-verbal communication. Analogue and digital communication. Oral and written communication. Dimensions and communication skills. Comprehension and expression. Communicative skills.

Topic 5. Conflict prevention and the improvement of interaction in socio-educational and family contexts.
