### 5. Assessment system

The final grade of the subject depends on three evaluation tests:

Reading review (30% of the final grade). Preparation of an individual critical comment based on the academic articles or readings recommended by the teaching staff within the framework of the subject.

Written test (20% of the final grade). The student must demonstrate their understanding of the contents of the subject and

design a practical intervention proposal based on this knowledge.

Directed work (50% of the final grade). Preparation of a group work on some of the central themes of the subject to be agreed upon with the teaching staff. Includes the presentation and oral defense of said work.

To pass the subject it is necessary to pass each of the evaluation tests.

#### Global test and second call

In the second call, each student will be able to choose between an overall test following the global evaluation model described above, or choose to recover the evaluation test that they had not initially passed (this partial grade is saved only within the same course).

#### Fifth and sixth call

In the same terms as the global evaluation.

### Important observations
