5.1. General methodological presentation

Due to the practical nature of this course, most of the sessions will be devoted to exercises which deal with all the competences that the students are expected to develop. By means of a variety of individual and group tasks, not only will they learn the linguistic elements required for this development, but they will, above all, practice the use of the English language as an instrument of oral and written communication in the contexts and situations specified with the objective of consolidating MCERL level A2.

5.2.Learning activities



25575 - Modern Language for Philosophy (English)

1. Theoretical and practical sessions with an explanation of the various aspects of English included in the program and exercises designed to deal with them.

2. Practical sessions where the students apply the learned resources and strategies by means of listening, speaking, role-playing, debate and other activities.

3. Practical sessions consisting of the explanation and correction of the mistakes made by the students in their written work, concerning grammar, lexicon and structure.

5.3.Program

1. A. Mood Food: Food and cooking; present simple and continuous, action and non-action verbs; short and long vowel sounds.

B. Family Life: Family, adjectives of personality; future forms: present continuous, *going to*, will/won't; sentence stress, word stress.

2. A. Spend or save?: Money; Present perfect and past simple.

- B. Changing Lives: strong adjectives (*exhausted*, *amazed*); sentence stress, stress on strong adjectives.
- 3. A. Race across London: Transport; comparative and superlatives.
- B. Stereotypes; Collocation: verbs/ adjectives + prepositions; articles: *a/an, the*, no article.
- 4. A. Failure or Success; ed /- ing adjectives; can, could, be able to ; reflexive pronouns.
- B. Modern manners: Phone langu>= modals of obligation: *must, have to, should*.

5.4. Planning and scheduling

-Start of sessions: presentation and explanation of the course program.

-Theory and practical sessions structured around the aforementioned activities.

-Final exam to be taken on the official date.
