Active Music Listening is a 6 ECTS credits course to be taken in the first semester. Theoretical and practical sessions are held throughout the semester.

This course is conceived as being one of the basics at the specialty in Music Education. It aims to provide students with the necessary tools for the development of perception and musical expression as well as its pedagogy and skills for an



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effective development in primary education. In addition, this course enhances student sensitivity for the use of music listening as a means of perception and expression in primary education level.
