5.1.General methodological presentation

The learning process designed for this subject is based on the following:

Sessions on the theoretical contents of the subject. The teacher present and discuss in the classroom general and methodological aspects of the detailed contents on the agenda. These sessions take the form of interactive exhibits, with student participation.

Practice sessions, supervised by the teacher. Its aim is that students are able to take decisions that will allow solving problems related to land use. It is intended them to familiarize with key information sources and the proper treatment of obtained information by applying the most common methods and techniques.

Seminars aim to promote, through discussion, reasoning ability and communication. The seminars will guide the exchange of ideas about issues that are on agendas.

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Field work. It will allow students to observe "in situ" some cases of territorial disorders and of ordered spaces. Fieldwork will help the student in the interpretation of the territory.

Tutorial. Facilitates the monitoring of the teaching-learning process and the group or individualized counseling on development of practical work and seminars.
