| 5.2.Learning activities |
| Moodle will be used to inform students about the tasks to carry out. They will have access to that information using the platform on https://moodle.unizar.es/ |
| Students will make oral presentations along the semester. They will follow the structure given in class. Also, the structure of the paragraph will be taught in class. Later, students will practice on their own. Listening comprehension exercises will be done on a regular basis in class. As concerns reading comprehension, some texts will be read and analysed in class. However, students are prompted to practice this skill on their own as well. |
| 5.3.Program |
| The syllabus of Lengua Inglesa I is as follows: |
| Grammar: full revision of verbal tenses, the use of modal verbs, conditional and time sentences, comparative and superlative adjectives, and relative clauses. |
| Vocabulary: food, icons and leadership, family and military organization, money and shopping, sport, manners, means of transport and travelling, appearances and physical description, education, houses and description of places. |
| Writing : Knowing the writing process of the paragraph, knowing its structure; how to write a paragraph. |



Speaking: making a basic oral presentation knowing all its parts. Making use of the grammar and lexis pointed out in the first two points.
