The work placement is organised in order to provide the students with a good preparation for a real enterprise environment. So the students are given the opportunity to apply the knowledges acquired at the classroom, to improve their abilities for team work and to acquire a valuable experience wich could led to better job oportunities in future.

A system of double-tutor is established, since the trainee has the support of an academic tutor in the Geography

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Department and another tutor within the firm/institution of the placement.
