It will be crucial in finding, obtaining and processing the main sources of geographic and tourist information, and the use of mapping and spatial analysis techniques to facilitate the location, classification, prioritisation, and ultimately the analysis and assessment of tourist territorial resources.

5.2.Learning tasks

The program that the student is offered to help them achieve the expected results will include the following activities:

Theoretical classes (30 hours) in which basic theoretical and practical aspects are necessary for an understanding of this matter shall apply to encourage active participation and independent work of students.

The theoretical program is divided into the following topics:

- Topic 1 Conceptual introduction to the analysis of tourist territorial resources and the landscape as an integral element.
- Topic 2 Classification and types of tourist territorial resources.
- Topic 3 Geographical factors, development models and territorial impacts associated with tourist territorial resources
 of Spain:
- Coastal areas and coastal and island destinations
- Natural and mountain areas
- Rural inland areas
- Urban areas and historical cities
 - Topic 4 Techniques and sources for inventorying and evaluation in the analysis of tourist territorial resources. (Tangential study Topic)

Practical classes (30 hours): The lectures are interspersed with practical work based on the processing and analysis of sources of geographic and tourist information, case studies and management of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and cartographic viewers among other classroom aspects.

Scheduled tutorials (6 hours): Allow the teacher to continuously monitor student work. Moreover, it will allow the student to answer questions or present their progress in this area. These tutorials will be established in the schedule, which is indicated at the beginning of the course.
