# 5.2.Learning tasks

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Bibliographic research of the scientific evidence (2 ECTS). Once the student and supervisor agree on the topic, the student carries out the literature review on scientific databases, analyzes and synthetizes the collected information.
- Individual tutorials (1 ECTS). Online or face-to-face.
- Protocol design (1 ECTS). Objectives definition and methodology design.
- Dissertation preparation (7.5 ECTS). The student will develop the different sections of the work guided by their supervisor: information gathering, analysis, discussion and conclusions.
- Writting process (2 ECTS). The written document will synthesize all the sections and will justify the relevance of the work.
- Oral presentation (0.5 ECTS). The student will prepare a concise presentation of the work with its main conclusions.

## 5.4. Course planning and calendar
