##### 4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as:

- Explanation by the teacher.
- Discussion and dialogue between students, and with the teacher, particularly in sessions of texts.
- Reading and research by students.

##### 4.2.Learning tasks

This is a 6 ECTS course organized as follows:

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- Lectures. Explanation by the teacher.
- Discussion between students, and between them and the teacher, particularly in text sessions.
- Reading and research by the students.
- Additional activities. Courses, viewing movies and other activities of artistic and cultural interest.

The course will address the following topics:

1. Introduction: Problems in philosophy
2. Philosophy as problem. From myth to logos. Logos and Ser
3. Ontological problems. Being and becoming in Plato and Aristotle
4. Anthropological problems. Descartes, Hume, Kant and the subject
5. Epistemological problems. Kant, Idealism and truth
6. Political problems. Power, intellectual and people
