The general objective of this subject is that the student, from the knowledge of its contents, be able to explain the pathologies of communication and intervention techniques, applied to the professional development of Physiotherapy.

The subject will complement the performance of the physiotherapist, equipping him with new instruments to detect, diagnose and correct the different communication potologies, for good or only within interdisciplinary groups, get a more effective adaptation and readaptation to the social and working life of the individual.

Importance of learning goals

Methodological overview

The learning process that has been designed for this subject is based on the following:

The knowledge will be acquired by applying different methodologies: on the one hand in the theoretical classes the participation of the students will be promoted as well as the exhibition in them of some of the subjects of the program, on the other will be complemented in the hours of tutoring in which the Students will have the opportunity to learn individually and directly.

Learning tasks

The program offered to the student to help him achieve the expected results includes the following activities ...

1.- Theoretical face-to-face classes

Credits: 2,5

Teaching methodology: Work in a class group on the contents to be treated. Debates and comments of texts.

2.- Resolution of problems and cases

Credits: 1

Development of a field journal / portfolio by the student

Teaching methodology: Tool for the control of self-learning: expectations, experiences, doubts, ideas that the student will record throughout the course and that will serve to self-assess their achievements in the subject.

3.- Other activities of personal work of the student

Credits 2.5

Teaching methodology: Final exam.

4.- Tutorial of the student: indivdualized work through which continuous monitoring of the evolution of the teaching-learning process of each student can be carried out, as well as strengthening it, using motivation techniques towards personal effort.
