The Master's Dissertation (TFM) is an autonomous project or report aimed at demonstrating the knowledge, skills, aptitudes and attitudes acquired by the student throughout the Master's degree. This dissertation should be an original work, justified and argumented with the appropriate citing sources. In addition, the dissertation must be defended publicly and individually. The TFM is carried out in the last semester of the Master's, it is compulsory, and has allocated 9 ECTS.

**4.2.Learning tasks**

The student, in order to pass this course, should demonstrate the following results:

- 1: Be able to deepen and specialize in an area of interest.
- 2: Apply the knowledge and skills acquired during the Master's to a study area, showing proper management of terminology and sufficient knowledge of the issues raised in the disciplines related to the study of Tourism Management and Planning.
- 3: Be able to make effective use of the literature.
- 4: Familiarize with the procedures of research: documentary, collecting data, analysis and interpretation, writing of a final paper.
- 5: Be able to orally defend the arguments of the dissertation.

- 1: Attendance to the orientation seminar to prepare the dissertation.
- 2: Attendance to individualized tutorials at the beginning of the dissertation and during its preparation. They can be virtual too.
- 3: Preparing the dissertation.
