4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. It is based on active and practical methodologies that favour the development of critical thinking. After the theoretical presentation of the contents of each topic, the practical tasks include a series of assignments, with clear objectives, to be made in the workshop. The combination of practice and theory doesn't necessarily have the same sequence. Sometimes the theory part is needed in order to approach the assignments correctly. However, there are times when the theory part is given during or after the practical tasks, thus becoming a guide to the results obtained. In most cases, the practical assignments will have a natural reference.

Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester.

Classroom materials will be available via Moodle or email. These include a repository of the lecture notes used

in class, the course syllabus, as well as other course-specific learning materials, including a discussion forum.

Further information regarding the course will be provided on the first day of class.

4.2.Learning tasks

The course includes the following learning tasks:

- Lectures (90 hours). Compulsory attendance to the 30 sessions in the class/workshop: theory sessions, practical assignments, seminars, group sessions and complementary activities.
- **Autonomous work**. Extra hours committed to working in the workshop, studying, working on the sketchbook, checking the bibliography, or looking at paintings.
