2.2.Learning goals

4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. An active methodology is proposed to achieve both the objectives related to the acquisition of knowledge, as well as those related to the acquisition and / or development of skills and abilities. It will focus on activities to be developed by the students according to established guidelines for each one of them. Each assignment will be carried out in the classroom-workshop, following the following structural sequence: Proposal -Information - Development - Analysis of Results. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as AF1 lectures, AF2 practice sessions, AF3 theory sessions, AF4 seminars, AF5 workshops, AF6 oral presentations, AF7 course work, AF8 group work, AF9 reports, AF10 portfolios, AF11 Projects...

The teacher will propose these guidelines, introduce the students to the specific theme of each exercise, a topic that will refer to one or several of the course contents, and will tutorize the development of the assignments, the analysis and evaluation of the results. The tutorial sessions can be done individually or in group.

In addition to the central activity described, theory sessions will be scheduled to develop specific issues on the syllabus, or to contextualize the work, emphasize specific aspects of the same or, simply, serve to introduce the student and predispose him / her for its solving.

Students are expected to participate actively in the class throughout the semester.

Classroom materials will be available via e-mail. These include a repository of the lecture notes used in class, the course syllabus, as well as other course-specific learning materials.

Further information regarding the course will be provided on the first day of class.

Introductory theory session of the contents to be developed in each session.
Discussions, seminars, summaries, workshops and oral presentations.
Lectures. Essays and theoretical analysis of the course contents by the students.
Guided assignments. Elaboration of group projects from teacher proposals, exhibition of them.

Field work. Observation, collection of images and information from nearby environments susceptible to analysis, study and intervention.

The course will address the following topics:

Section 1. Initial Presentation

- Topic 1. Presentation and methodology of the course.
- Topic 2. Dossier of initial work. Personal project and artist statement. Workplan.

Section 2. Project Methodology

- Topic 1. Concept, definition and scope of the project. Types and Phases of the project.
- Topic 2. Instruments or tools of the project.
- Topic 3. The personal artistic project. Preliminary, process.

Section 3. Project Workshop

- Topic 1. The idea as a project. Conceptual art. Texts. Analysis of some works and projects.
- Topic 2. Projectual practice as a tool for artistic creation. Processual arts, body and time.
- Topic 3. Study, analysis, realization of projects with diverse methodologies and creative strategies.

Section 4. Personal Project

- Topic 1. Method / Guidelines and phases to develop personal artistic projects. Individual monitoring of the phases of the personal artistic project.

Section 5. Exhibition Project

- Topic 1. Guide for the development of exhibition projects and for the reports. Schedule of tasks and dates. Division of spaces and dates (scheduling).
- Topic 2. Division of tasks in the group: 1) previous tasks (plan inauguration, press dossier, documentation, catalog...); 2) 'during' tasks (parallel activities, maintenance, planned events, documentation ...); 3) post-exposure tasks (final definition of the documentation, video editing document, diffusion).

Section 6. Final Presentation

- Presentations and Assessment of the last sections of the course.
