4.1.Methodological overview

The methodology followed in this course is oriented towards the achievement of the learning objectives. A wide range of teaching and learning tasks are implemented, such as lectures, practice sessions and tutorials.

4.2.Learning tasks

This course is organized as follows:

Lectures (25 hours). Two-hours weekly sessions. Their main objective is conveying the fundamental concepts of

the subject, so that goals set by the teacher are achieved. The lecture is expected to be participatory and to encourage debate and clarify issues and questions based on the student handbook, the supporting literature for the course and materials provided in the Digital Platform (ADD).

- Practice sessions (25 hours). Resolution and presentation of case studies, preparation and presentation of papers, discussion of topics, and readings.
- **Tutorials** (12,5 hours) and evaluation that allow a more direct and personal support to students in order to monitor tasks, prepare and produce reports, answer questions and guide them in the study and resolution of exercise activities. These tutorials may be individual or in a group.
- Autonomous work and study (62,5 hours).
