- Topic 3. The translator's tools: dictionaries, reference books and new technologies.
- Topic 4. Translation strategies: transposition, modulation, adaptation and others.

Section II- The domain of Contrastive Linguistics (English-Spanish):

- Topic 5. Lexicogrammatical equivalence. Contrastive analysis of English and Spanish at word and phraseological level: interlinguistic transfer.
- Topic 6. Translation problems beyond the sentence: the pragmatic and discoursal level. Exploring the notion of context.
- Topic 7. Revising translations. Avoiding interlinguistic transfer: a linguistic taxonomy of errors.
