3. Feminist literary research II:
 1. Restoration of the visibility of women writers, a study of their work and insertion into the canon of literary history.

4. A brief overview of Spanish women writers from the Middle Ages to the present.
 1. Themes concerning feminism in novelists from the 20th and 21st centuries.
