- 10. Historical morphology and syntax of adverbs and relational elements.
- 11. Historical syntax evolution of Spanish (simple sentence).
- 12. Historical syntax evolution of Spanish (compound sentence).
- 13. The evolution of word order from Latin to Spanish.
