4.1. Methodological overview

The course includes theorical as well as practical content. The theory sessions will include also real world situations. During practice sessions, students will use the computers under the teacher's supervision.

In Section I practical topics, the students will analyze reports from international economic organizations, press news and other key material. From these materials, they will elaborate oral presentations and discussions. In Section II practical topics, students will solve case studies and problems by using the spreadsheet.

4.2.Learning tasks

The course will include theoretical as well as practical activities, as explained in the previous subsection.

4.3.Syllabus

The course will address the following topics:

SECTION I. Economics and economic policy: (1) Aggregate supply and aggregate demand. (2) Monetary and fiscal policies. (3) Foreign sector and exchage rate. (4) The firm and the market.

SECTION II. Financial mathematics. (1) Introduction. (2) Interest rates. (3) Cost and profitability in the financial operations. (4) Annuities analysis.

4.4.Course planning and calendar

The course includes 30 teaching hours. These hours will take place in lecture rooms and/or the computer room, which is mainly used for practice sessions.

The schedule and timetable will be announced to the students in due time.
